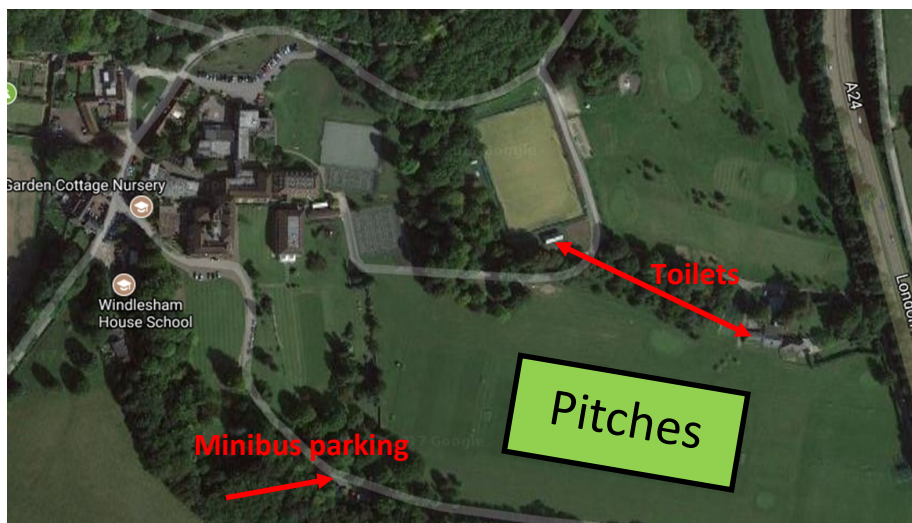

7 aside rules (unofficial):

- Teams should consist of up to 10 players no older than 11 years of age as of September 2018.
- The festival shall be played as a round-robin, so all teams will play each other.
- Matches will be 8 minutes one way, with no half time. There will be a central timekeeper to indicate the start and end of the game.
- Roll on, roll off subs can be made throughout the match when there is a 'dead ball' - ball is out of play, goal kicks, corner kicks.
- No pushing, tripping, dangerous tackles or foul play will be tolerated.
- Goal kicks to be taken from the top of the D. Goal keepers can leave the D but can only handle the ball with their hands in the D. They may kick the ball out of their hands.
- Free kicks (and corner/goal kicks)—opposing players must be at least 5 metres away.
- Shin pads and socks must be worn, and ideally all goalkeepers should wear goalkeeping gloves.
- Football boots are advisable but trainers/astros will be fine.
- Captains/coaches should make sure that their team is ready to start asap. Captains should toss for choice of end or kick off.
- To promote the enjoyment of the game, referees will not keep score. All players will receive a certificate, captains to collect them and hand to their coaches.

Please note: Teachers or coaches will be asked to referee a match their team plays in. Please liaise with the opposing team.

Other information:

- Please park your minibus in our minibus parking bays. Members of staff will be around to direct you if the spaces are full.
- Please encourage your girls to bring their own water and extra clothing if it is cold.
- Toilets will be open by our astro for the children. Coaches/Spectators can use the ones in the the cricket pavilion.
